Almighty God, the **fountain** of all **wisdom**, you know our needs before we ask. Have compassion on our weakness, and grant us those blessings, for which we dare not ask.

Heavenly Father, bless, we pray you, our most gracious sovereign lady, Queen Elizabeth, as Governor of this Church of England. Replenish her with the grace of the Holy Spirit, and grant her health and a long life.

We pray for Rowan, our Archbishop of Canterbury, and for those charged with recommending his successor, for John and Colin our bishops, and for Toby, Elizabeth, Joanna and Sally, our priests, and all those who support them in their ministry. Grant to them all, and members of their councils, wisdom and patience, as they seek to heal the deep divisions in the church, and to spread the good news of the Gospel.

Heavenly Father, you have included all your commandments, in the one commandment of love, that we should love our neighbours as ourselves; so that, if we love *not* our neighbour, we cannot fulfil your law. Help us to interpret your law of love, in the context of our daily lives.

Bless all those who have recently married, or who are preparing for marriage. May their love for each other, mirror your love for them.

Bless the children, who have recently been baptised, or who are being prepared for baptism.

Bless all those who have received, or are anxiously awaiting the results of public examinations; those about to start a new school, college or university; and those who are looking for, or starting their first job.

Bless all travellers and holiday makers, that *holidays* may be Holy-days. Grant them refreshment of spirit, and renewal of strength.

Today we pray for Simon Brayton, Joy Jones, Liz Hodges, Heather, Kathleen Barnes, Martine, and Don Lawes, and for all those known to us individually, who need *your* love, *our* prayers and *our* support.
