In the power of the Holy Spirit and in union with Christ, let us pray to the Father.

As this world-wide Anglican church, deliberates on who should be our next Archbishop of Canterbury, grant to those whose decision it is, wisdom, forethought, though the grace and guidance of the Holy Spirit.

We ask for tolerance and understanding, for them and for ourselves, in discussing the deep issues which threaten to tear the church apart.

We pray for all clergy, as they seek to lead their flocks in the way of Christ.

Lord we continue to pray for peaceful outcomes, to seemingly intractable problems in your world. For Israel and Palestine, for Northern Ireland and this week's significant step towards a lasting peace. For Iraq trying to work out a future democracy. Give wisdom and understanding, tolerance and skill, to our leaders and negotiators. Without compromise on all sides, there *is* no possibility of lasting peace.

The Book of Proverbs tells us that "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom." Help us all to realise, that everything we do, should be based on the two commands of Jesus, to love God, and to love our neighbour as ourselves.

We pray O Father, that when the interests and aspirations of nations conflict with one another, their leaders may not turn to war, but together seek a just and acceptable way forward. So that suspicions may be allayed, misunderstanding clarified, violence averted, and peace preserved.

Lord we pray for our families, here and in other parts of your world. For our friends and neighbours, and for all those people upon whom we depend, day by day. No-one is an island. Help us, regardless of our own problems, to help others.
