HT Intercessions 19th January 2014

"Lord teach us how to pray aright, with reverence and with awe."

Heavenly Father, in this week of Prayer for Christian Unity, we pray for a better understanding between the churches and their people. Bless all who guide us in the way of Christ. We pray for Archbishop Justin, Pope Francis, our Bishops John and Colin, our clergy, Toby in his extended role as Area Dean, Elizabeth as she prepares for her new work in Derby, for Alistair as he prepares for his ordination as priest, for Joy Hance our new assistant priest starting next month, for our assistant priests and lay ministers, and for the work of the Churches together in Witney.
