“Thou knowest Lord, the secrets of our hearts.”

Heavenly Father, as we *open* our hearts before you, we beseech you to hear us, and to help us.

We pray for your world; the world you created, and saw that it was good. But we are conscious of our human mismanagement of its finite resources; the hate, the wars, the disputes, the jealousies, and the selfishness. Help us to play *our* part, in healing our divisions, husbanding our resources, and spreading peace and hope.

We long for the rulers of the nations, to heal *their* divisions, by the right use of their power. Change the hearts and minds of the aggressors, that they may turn to love and peace.

Heavenly Father, at the end of this *Week of Prayer for Christian Unity*, we pray for Queen Elizabeth, the supreme governor of this, our Church of England, for our archbishops, our bishops, our clergy, their assistants, and their congregations. We also pray for the clergy and peoples of *all* Christian denominations. Pour your Holy Spirit into the hearts of every one of us, and show us the way of true *unity*, which is our love for you; whilst accepting that *uniformity*, can stifle freedom of expression and worship.

Heavenly Father, we are constantly reminded of the plights of our neighbours around the world; those fighting for their freedom from oppression, or caught up in conflicts not of their own making;

Help us to consider, what small part *we* might play, in alleviating their suffering, through prayer, action, and charitable giving of our time and talents.
