Heavenly Father, we believe that you hear our prayers, and will be faithful to your promise to answer them.

Bless, we pray you, Queen Elizabeth, the supreme Governor of this Church of England. Bless our archbishops and bishops, our clergy, their assistants, and *us*, as members of their congregations. Forgive us *all*, our fears, our anxieties, our prejudices, and our misunderstandings. Strengthen our common bonds, and deepen our resolve to promote the *unity*, of your church.

Lord, in your mercy. Hear our prayer.

Heavenly Father, you have included *all* your commandments, in the one commandment, that we should love our neighbours as ourselves, so that, if we love *not* our neighbour, we cannot fulfil your law. Help us to interpret your law of love, in the context of our daily lives. Heavenly Father, we pray that your love may be felt by people in their darkest hours. We think of the families and friends of those caught up in the many struggles and wars be waged around your World; the lonely, the disturbed; the bereaved; the oppressed; those displaced from their homes and lands; the hungry; the sick in mind, body and spirit; prisoners of conscience; victims of fire, famine and flood; and of

earthquakes. Particularly we pray for Dave Wong, whose wife Julie is now assumed to have died, when her office block collapsed in Christchurch, though her body has not yet been recovered, and for their four year old son Ethan, who is left without a mother. Grant them strength, comfort, courage and peace, as they try to build a new life. We remember too, the rescue workers, the charities, the aid agencies, and the medical teams, who seek to bring relief and support around the World. Help *us*, *too*, to remember at this time of financial restraint, that without *our* support, *they* cannot carry on their humanitarian work.

Lord, in your mercy, Hear our prayer.

Heavenly Father, we ask you to pour out your love on *our* families and friends, here and abroad, and on the members of our community: those individuals and families, who are affected by the current financial problems, for those who have lost their jobs, or cannot find work. We pray for the members of our local Camaras, who have to balance their finances, and manage our services, grant them wisdom and patience. We remember; think about; and pray for, all our neighbours who are in any way distressed: particularly Alan Homer (priest), ______ Grant them calm acceptance of their plight, peace of mind, and the knowledge of your love.

Heavenly Father, we commend into your loving keeping, the souls of Dennis Hayes, Julie Wong and Hazel McCormack, _______ and all who have recently died, whether or not they knew your love in their *Earthly* lives. Grant to their eternal spirits, your light, your peace and your love; and comfort those who are left to mourn their passing. And as we keep a moment of silence, we remember those known to us individually, who need *our* prayers, *our* support, and *your* love.
